



Work Crew Information

As a Work Crew member for the Revelation Wellness IMPACT event, your service allows RW retreat participants to be refueled so that they can bring the message of loving God, getting healthy, being whole and loving others into their communities.

Lost Canyon does not hire additional dining room staff, dishwashers, or retail staff. They require every group who uses their facility to provide people to serve in each of these positions. The exact number of Work Crew members needed is determined by Lost Canyon staff based on the number of participants registered for the event.

Work Crew members may be adults or high school students (at least 14 years old), so feel free to invite a family member to serve with you!

Serving on the Lost Canyon Work Crew is a position of humility and honor. Our goal is to make Christ the center focus of this week. Servant leaders keep their eyes open for what God is up to and the needs of the people around them.

It takes many people to host any Revelation Wellness event with excellence. Work Crew and the IMPACT Leadership Team are *two completely different teams*, both with one goal - *to serve those who attend*.

It is important to understand that the Work Crew team serves with the Work Crew team, and the IMPACT Leadership Team serves with the IMPACT Team. Meals, sleeping arrangements, and spiritual development time will all take place with your Work Crew team.

Due to the timing of the event and demands of the Work Crew role, there is not a lot of crossover time. One team is not better than the other; it simply means that each team is walking out the assignment He has called each of us to for such a time as this. We are one body, with many parts, all for the glory of God and edification of the Body!



Work Crew Expectations - Eight things to know to make your time a success

1. The goal of Lost Canyon is to **serve guests like Christ would serve them**: in a humble and generous way that provides a context in which people feel loved and welcome.
2. Every group is required to bring a team of people to provide help in the kitchen, dining room, dishwashing area and retail spaces. **Work Crew members will be expected to serve wherever needed throughout the week.**
3. Work Crew must be a minimum of 14 years old, **able to lift or carry 30-50 pounds, and physically able to be standing and walking while working for up to 10-12 hours.**
4. Work Crew will be responsible for: **food prep, dining room set up, serving meals, retail areas, and cleaning.** The camp staff will provide leadership and training for all that needs to happen associated with food service and retail spaces. At the end of each day, the dining and kitchen facility and retail areas are to be completely cleaned, closed, and ready for the next day.
5. **Work Crew Orientation is required for all.** Training cannot begin until the whole group is present. If the Work Crew does not arrive on time for training, please know it may push back all scheduled events.

Even if you have served on Work Crew before, you must receive the required safety training EVERY time you serve.

6. To maintain a professional appearance and to follow local health codes, **Work Crew will wear appropriate attire**: Shirt with sleeves, pants or long shorts, closed-toed shoes (no sandals), shoulder-length or longer hair tied back, free of jewelry or accessories on hands & wrists, healthy hygiene, etc. You will need to dress for the climate and for the job.
7. After the last meal of the week, there are several **final cleaning tasks** that will take approximately 2 hours. All hands on deck will need to work diligently and efficiently in order to make our scheduled departure smooth.
8. **As mentioned above**, the Work Crew is not part of the Leadership Team nor a full IMPACT participant, because your jobs will take a majority of your time. While there are generally breaks between each meal and Work Crew is managed in such a way to get plenty of rest, you can expect to work 9-12 hours/day.
9. As of the writing of this document, per Lost Canyon's protocol, all Work Crew are required to wear masks in the Dining Hall.

You are of course welcome to attend any IMPACT sessions and activities once Work Crew tasks are completed and approved by the Work Crew Boss.



Sample Day on Work Crew:

7:30 AM Breakfast Preparation
8:00 AM Work Crew Eats Breakfast
9:00 AM Breakfast Service
9:45-11:45 AM Clean and reset for Lunch*
12:00 PM Work Crew Eats Lunch
1:00 PM Lunch Service
2:00-4:00 PM Clean and reset for Dinner*
5:30 PM Work Crew Eats Dinner
6:30 PM Dinner Service
7:30 PM Clean up from Dinner service*

* Clean and reset likely will not take the full two hours.

**Coffee shop shifts begin at 5:30am, but you likely will not have to work more than one morning in the coffee shop.

A Servant Leader is Someone Who:

- Believes that Jesus came to restore us, transform us, and set us free, and knows that God is doing that through His ministry of Revelation Wellness (Galatians 5:1)
- Has come to serve and not be served (Matthew 20:28)
- Serves from their overflow that comes from the Lord (1 John 4:19)
- Serves with a heart of joy (Ephesians 6:7-8)
- Keeps their eyes open for where the Spirit is working and goes there (John 5:19)
- Listens more than they talk (James 1:19)
- Is not easily offended (Proverbs 18:19)
- Is called to find a need and meet it, or see a hurt and heal it (Luke 10:30-35)
- Knows that when they are irritated by someone else, that they too also bring their own sin to the table (James 4:1-3)
